


Food, Friends, Fun, Good Cheer

Human Trafficking

January is **Human Trafficking Awareness Month**. In 2013 the **Summit College Club/AAUW**, the **LWV/BHNPS**, and the **Junior League of Summit** partnered to create a community wide program to educate the Summit area on Human Trafficking. The LWV/BHNPS is collecting donations this month to aid survivors of Human Trafficking. At the January 22nd Rosa Parks film, the LWV information table will have a basket to collect donations--cash, checks, or gift cards--for HT victims rescued by the FBI in

New Jersey. Meanwhile, **The New Jersey Coalition against Human Trafficking** is holding a free day-long event on January 11, which is National Human Trafficking Awareness Day.

At Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital in New Brunswick, the event includes a keynote speaker, various experts, and Q & A. Registration begins at 8:30 AM and the event includes a continental breakfast and a light lunch. **www.NJHUMANTRAFFICKING.org** has further information.



Great Decisions

The League of Women Voters is sponsoring **Great Decisions 2017**. Produced by the Foreign Policy Institute, Great Discussions is America's largest discussion program on world affairs. The series, which costs \$95 (\$85 for LWV and Interweave members), runs from February 1 through March 29: eight meetings

The group will meet at the DeCorso Community Center, 15 East 4th Street, New Providence. Each meeting includes a brief video clip, a discussion moderated by a facilitator, and an opinion poll that is later returned to Congress and other departments of the government.
